

# Prohibition signs



<u>Target group</u>	5 to 6 years
<u>Material</u>	Paper, pencils, painting, water bottles, wax crayons and etc.
<u>Procedure</u>	<p>In city streets and various homes it's possible to see the following statement :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Unauthorised access is prohibited,</li> <li>• No dogs,</li> <li>• No garbage.</li> </ul> <p>Imagine that some heroes from well-known tales have also decided to hang prohibiting notes in their cities.</p>
<u>Variations</u>	<p>It's possible to change the topic to create multiple prohibiting notes, which could be for example.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Snow Queen's palace,</li> <li>• Ali Baba's cave,</li> <li>• Cinderella,</li> <li>• Emerald City,</li> <li>• Doctor Do-little in the hospital.</li> </ul>
<u>Aims</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make new experiences of colours, tools;</li> <li>• To help kids to understand what different prohibition signs mean, why we need them;</li> <li>• To let out children's imagination.</li> </ul>
