





A picture with one detail

One of the buildings

<u>Target group</u>	From 3 to 6 years old
<u>Material</u>	 Some pictures with of buildings Some pictures with details of a building (see the picture on right for example) Sheets of paper Cardboard frame
<u>Procedure</u>	 The teacher gives a picture for 2 children (one picture for 3 children when younger). They receive a picture showing a detail of a building. The children must find the detail on the building.
	-To help them find the detail, they can take a sheet of paper and roll it like a telescope. Or they can take a cardboard frame and



	look inside. - The children have 5 different details to find on different buildings
<u>Variations</u>	 Children must find a detail and draw this detail. The children are in groups of 2. Each group has a detail. They give tips to another group about that detail for them to find it.
<u>Aims</u>	 Being forced to look at a building in detail. Competences to observe the environment: Learn to observe in details Learn to look at things from another perspective Change the perspective : through a roll, a frame)
<u>Comments</u>	Younger children receive bigger details to look for.
