Different materials



Target group	From 3 to 6 years old
Material	 A shoe box with 6 holes Stones, wood, glass, metal, plaster, aluminium
<u>Procedure</u>	Children are in the town. They observe the buildings. After that, they put a hand in a hole and touch the material. When they have touched it, they try to find which element is made with this material in the building.
<u>Variations</u>	 Make it with elements from a park. Make it with elements from the classroom (pencils, gum, feather, paper,) After the visit children reuse the same material to represent what they have seen
<u>Aims</u>	The children discover the various materials which compose a building. - Refine one's tactile perceptions • Learn to distinguish different characteristics of different materials • Learn to identify elements from the environment by
