Observing the buildings



Target group	6 years old
<u>Material</u>	charcoal pencil and paper
<u>Procedure</u>	We go with the children to a square. First we look around and observe the buildings around us. We divide the children into two groups. They can observe the little details on the buildings. For example: what colour is it, what kind of texture is it made of, etc. The groups decide on a little detail on a building. For example: there is a windmill on the balcony and it has yellow and green colours. They tell another group they have to find a green and

	yellow thing. The other group has to figure out what the others were thinking of.
	They can also draw a little detail of the building, for example, in the balcony there is a spiral pattern. After the drawing the teacher divides the children into two groups. Every child has to think a sound which is connected with their drawing. (A spiral pattern can be a fast, high voice.) It can be every kind of voice. A group can make a little choir from the different sounds.
<u>Variations</u>	If somebody doesn't have a good idea to make a sound, it is possible to do a movement or a dance.
Aims	This activity can improve their observation skills
