Discovering nature elements



Target group	5 year old
<u>Material</u>	 newspapers camera scarves (so you can blindfold the children) blanket photographs of different mosaics
<u>Procedure</u>	1. Walk true the park First we go to the park/forest and walk around and look around. Then we make a big circle so we can talk and tell what we are going to do. 2. Newspaper

The children will be blindfolded and will get a newspaper. You ask them to think about a tree or a flower or anything that they saw during the walk true the park/forest. You ask them to rip the paper and make the form of the thing that they are thinking about When they have finished, you lay down all the ripped papers and look at them. The children guess what it is. 3. Mosaics After this exercise the children go and find all sorts of nature materials (flowers, branches, leaves, stones, ...). They collect as many things as possible and lay them on a blanket in the circle. We look at them and tell what we see. Now you show them pictures of different mosaics and tell what a mosaic is. The idea is that the children will make their own mosaic together with all the materials that they have collectted earlier. Variations - you can discuss the details of all the materials they have found in the park/forest -you can select / classify the materials -you can first let them rip the form out of the paper blindfolded and after that not blindfolded and discuss the difference <u>Aims</u> Social -emotional competences -get to know others, establish relationships with others Competences to observe the environment -tactile -discover one's body in relation with the environment -learn to observe in details -learn to compare Competences in the different subject areas in order to discover the environment -art

<u>Comments</u>	-make sure you go to a big park/forest so there's a lot to see
	- Make sure that you make rules and restrictions about the area the children can go to in the park/forest
