## Words into a story





Target group	5 years old
Material	- for the teacher a pad to write down the words - a sheet of paper and a pen for every kid a place, a church, a park, a building,
Procedure	<ol> <li>Children are in a place chosen by the teacher. They observe alone during a few minutes. After that, they must draw on their paper what they think about this place (their real-life experience, their emotions, an element of the place which they like)</li> <li>When the children have finished their drawings, every child present his drawing to the group</li> <li>Or</li> <li>They have a moment to observe all drawings on a table and then we talk about them. "Describe the drawing! What does it mean? What is your emotion about this drawing?"</li> <li>2) After talking about the drawing, the children choose max. 10 drawings and they put them in a chronological order</li> </ol>
<u>Variations</u>	to tell a story.  In place of (2), all drawings are placed in a pile in the

	middle and a child takes one at random and they talk about
	it.
