

Candy Paper



<u>Target group</u>	5 to 6 years old
<u>Material</u>	Coloured pencils, The teacher must to prepared stencil where they can use for making their own candy papers.
<u>Procedure</u>	<p>When in the city make pictures of different candies, chocolate, etc.</p> <p>Back in the classroom classify the pictures: colours, pictures, shapes, etc.</p> <p>Tell to children that they are artists and work for a candy factory. They need to illustrate pieces of candy paper for chocolate, cookies or candies. But in wrapping paper is supposed to reflect the child's creativity (for example: colours)</p> <p>So they first choose what they want to wrap in the paper they will create, then they create the wrapping paper and finally they explain to the others why they have chosen to do it in this or that way.</p>
<u>Variations</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Another suggestion is to take another topic (calendar events, city at the night, nature, animals)
