## Finding shapes in the city



<u>Target group</u>	5 years old
<u>Material</u>	<ul> <li>Camera</li> <li>Paper</li> <li>Pencil, Pens,</li> <li>Mirrors</li> <li>Binoculars</li> </ul>
<u>Procedure</u>	<ul> <li>Go to a place in a city where you have space to sit and to discover the surrounding.</li> <li>Tell the children how far they are allowed to go,</li> <li>Let them describe the place in their own words.</li> <li>Talk about shapes. Which shapes do they know? (triangle, circle, square,)</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Writy we dre here?</li> <li>We will make a little documentary about the buildings and the elements on the facades and structures we can see.</li> <li>Search for some shapes all around the place. On the walls, on the floor, in some shops. Make photos from them or draw them on some paper.</li> <li>Bring them all together and talk about these forms, what is typical for them?</li> <li>At the kindergarden or in the city you can print the pictures.</li> <li>All together sort them out, classify them, make some posters which the kids can show to some other children from their group or the parents, grandparents,</li> <li>Talk about some other shapes.</li> </ul>
<u>Variations</u>	Find more specific shapes Find some ornaments Let them think about things in the nature with this kind of shapes. If you do not go to a special place you can to it in the kindergarden as well.
<u>Aims</u>	First images of geometric forms Learning how to use a camera Find elements in the environment and become awake of looking for something.
