Also the program was about discovering with all the senses. I already knew this was important but I know now that I don't do it enough during my internships. For myself it was also very enriching to discover the environment with all my senses. For example being blindfolded when you walk into the city, being blindfolded when you need to taste something, just feel at some things and then guess what it was,... Now I will discover a lot more with the senses during my internships (and later as a teacher in my own class).

At last I learned a lot about myself during this program. I learned to deal with a "child with a special need". In Belgium they aren't sitting in the same classes then "normal children". When I saw in Belgium a child with a special need, I always tried to avoid it. Just because I don't feel comfortable in a situation like that. But now I see that also these kids are really nice to work with and that you can get a lot of appreciation from them.

I was amazed that my English at the end of the week was so much better than in the beginning. It was nice to learn new words and think about how you must say something (because there was not always an opportunity/ a teacher,.. to translate it).





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The last, but not the least important thing I would like to say, is that I made plenty of new friends! In the group there was a lot of harmony, the best example for this was the 'Flash mob' we did in the city. It was not always that easy to work so hard together, with different opinions, but after all, we all were very happy with the nice results! I met some people and I know for sure that these friendships will last.
