When I heard about the possibility to participate in this programme I thought that it would be a really good experience for my future career. Despite this I still had some doubts: how difficult or easy it would be for me, would I make the language barrier, would I be comfortable being in a multicultural community? All these questions were bothering me, so I was hesitating. All in all I've decided to participate, because you can never know how many interesting things you'll find in your way.

I have found many things. From the personal side I had a possibility to know myself better. I've reformed my values, my point of view. Also I could evaluate my strong and weak sides. I've found so many roads which I can go and feel happy. The most important thing I understood being here in Namur was that without other people, without your friends or colleagues you cannot do much.

I admired other cultures: their languages, traditions, food, songs and etc. These two weeks made me think about cultural differences and similarities. I understood that we all are humans but at the same moment we are unique personalities. Sometimes I felt the fear of otherness, but now I want to know other cultures better and to reveal the beauty of my culture as well.

From the professional side I got so many ideas which I will use with the children in Lithuania. First of all I was very happy that I found a beauty of land-art. That was a really good experience for me as a future teacher. I admired all the activities which we had done during the whole intensive programme. I will never forget the words: "The main thing is what you really want to say and why". I knew that working with children under 6 is the very important thing for me as for an educator because this is a decisive age where everything is being constructed for their further life. So I want to thank all IP participants for being there and working together.

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
