

Describing my view



<u>Target group</u>	4-6 years old children
<u>Material</u>	A park or a place with an open view.
<u>Procedure</u>	We divide the kids into two groups (depending on how many kids you have). They have to sit in a circle back to back, facing the surrounding. One kid says one word about what he/she can see : verb, adjective, colour, smells, and sounds, so anything you can find. The teacher has to write down every word each child says (you could use those for later activities). The game is finished when they can't say any other word.

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<u>Variations</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - You make a smaller or a bigger group so that the angle is different. - They can only say a word once (for older children) and if they don't, they get eliminated. - They have to change their places in order to see a different point of view. - Especially in a small group, you could use a frame to reduce the view.
<u>Aims</u>	<p>Learn to look at things from another perspective.</p> <p>Learn to observe in details using the senses.</p> <p>Language : describing what you see, hear, smell</p>
<u>Comments</u>	<p>This game is good for the kids to calm down and to concentrate.</p>
