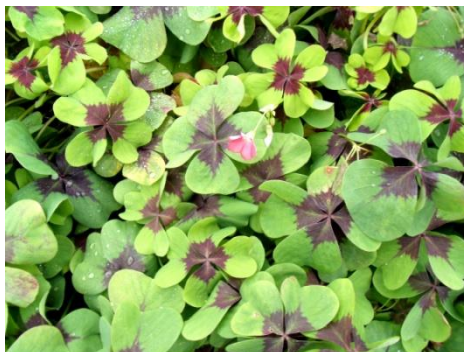


Nature art



<u>Target group</u>	Age: 3-6
<u>Material</u>	None (only a natural place with trees, flowers, etc.)
<u>Procedure</u>	<p>The teacher tells the children that they have to look for something that they like but that these things have to be in their natural place.</p> <p>Then, the children have to show what they have chosen to the other children and they have to explain why they have chosen these things : in turns they have to describe their things and say why they like them.</p>
<u>Variations</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Later the children can collect a lot of things provided they don't destroy anything in the nature, this means they can only take things that are on the ground. The teacher puts them into a box and each child, with his/her eyes blind, has to place his/her hand into the box and he/she has to catch one thing and has to guess what it is. - After the children have collected a lot of things, they have to create a story using as many things as possible from

	<p>what they have collected.</p>
<p><u>Aims</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dare making new experiences in the nature (touch the earth, smell different odours, create with elements found in the nature,...) - Learn to collaborate in a common project (listen to others' propositions, discuss,...) - Learn to distinguish different characteristics of different materials. - Learn to identify elements from the environment by touching them. - Develop vocabulary to express what you feel and develop vocabulary connected with the different senses. - Describe what one has observed. - Establish connections between objects found in the nature (material, characteristics, size...)
