

# Statue of clay

<u>Target group</u>	4-5-6 years old children
<u>Material</u>	None
<u>Procedure</u>	<p>This game is to be played after a discovery in the city or a park. The children sit in a circle. One child makes something from « imaginary clay ». It is supposed to be something they have seen during the discovery, e.g. a traffic light, a tree, a bench, ... The other children have to look carefully and say what they think it is. There are no correct or false answers in this game, it is about what the children think they see, what they interpret. This may differ from child to child, depending on his or her previous experiences and what the child observed during the discovery. The child who makes something with his 'clay', shows it and gives it to the next child. This child kneads the clay again and makes something new</p>
<u>Variations</u>	None
<u>Aims</u>	<p>The children recreate their experiences with the imaginary clay. The children learn to look at things from a different perspective and experience that each has different observations during a discovery. This activity also develops the creativity and the imagination of children.</p>
