

Imitate a story (B2)



<p><u>Target group</u></p>	<p>Age : 4-6 1 adult : groups of 4-5</p>
<p><u>Material</u></p>	<p>Story (children book that fits in the context) E.g. 'L'arbre en bois' Natural materials, toys. Paper. Picture of the main scene from the story.</p>
<p><u>Procedure</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The teacher reads the story to all the children. - With the picture of the main scene they discuss the story. The teacher also brings materials and toys so that the children can replay the story. - The children choose one scene that they can remake with natural materials. They discuss with the whole group which materials can be used. Groups are made. The children are divided into groups, depending on which scene they want to recreate. - Go outside, search and collect materials. - Start building the setting, stick the elements on paper or make it in the nature. - The children use their creations to retell (parts of)

	<p>the story.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Exhibition for the parents and other children
<u>Variations</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pictures are made of the creations and put in a book. In this way the children can read the story with their own pictures. - Reenactment of their own experience and discussion about it in groups. - Dramatisation of the story
<u>Aims</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The children learn to recognize and accept differences between each other. - The children establish connections between objects found in the nature. - By observing and comparing, the children will be able to use their counting and sorting abilities . They will train their associative skills by putting the things into different categories: minerals, plants, animals etc. - The children use objects from nature to illustrate a story.
