## Day with smells (b1)



Target group	Age : 4-6 1 adult Groups of 4-5 children
<u>Material</u>	Little cups Different natural materials with a special smell Scarves
<u>Procedure</u>	<ul> <li>Let the children discover the different smells (like grass, lavender, trees, straw, wood, earth). Let them explore the smells by putting them on a table so that they can play (and smell) with them in their free time.</li> <li>The teacher observes the children's behaviour and asks some questions.</li> <li>Do you like this? Why this smell?</li> <li>Why did you put it here?</li> <li>What can you do with it?</li> <li></li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The teacher takes a group with her. With this group he/she is going to discover one smell and what it's made of. What is this smell? Does it smell nice or not? Also introduce material that doesn't have a specific smell, like water, Discover individual opinions and differences between each other's tastes.</li> <li>Afterwards they can play with the different smells. They need to smell and tell what they think it is. It can be a play in the morning or to get their attention.</li> </ul>
<u>Variations</u>	<ul> <li>With food or other things.</li> <li>Start in the classroom smelling things from the nature.</li> <li>And then go outside to find the same smell.</li> <li>Tasting and feeling</li> </ul>
Aims	<ul> <li>The children learn to trust others.</li> <li>They learn to distinguish different odors (tastes).</li> <li>They use their senses to discover the vegetal world.</li> <li>They establish connections between objects found in the nature.</li> </ul>
