## Listen to the nature (B1)



Target group  Material	Age: 4-6 1 adult for 5-10 children  Funnels, recorder, pencils
Procedure	<ul> <li>Introduce a real map (what we see, find, topology, rivers, mountains, city, buildings,)</li> <li>Let the kids make a map based on the criteria of the real map.</li> <li>Making of the map         <ul> <li>First draw the map with a pencil.</li> <li>the marker for the big roads</li> <li>then use colours for the rivers, woods</li> </ul> </li> <li>For the kids who can't draw, give them the possibility to use pictures of trees, rivers, castles, to stick on the map. (not obligated)</li> <li>Introduce material, explain to the kids what are they going to use for (funnel)</li> <li>Explain to the kids what they are going to do with the material: discover an area based on the "handmade map" map and use the funnel to listen to the different</li> </ul>

	sounds and use the recorder to record the different sounds  - Explore and look for noises and sounds in the woods and try to know where they come from.  - Share their experience and tell the story about their adventure (what they have found, listen).  Evaluation  → Exhibition in the class of the different maps.  → Listen again to the sounds on the recorder and try to find the origin.
<u>Variations</u>	- Make a map in groups
