

What's mine ? (C2)



<u>Target group</u>	4-5 years
<u>Material</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Sticks- Stones- Grass- Leaves- Things from nature
<u>Procedure</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Each child finds his own (only one) material and he has to get familiarized with it (touch it, look at it, turn it, shake it, ...)- The child has to remember all the characteristics of his material- The teacher collects all the objects chosen by the children.- All the children have to stay in a line with their hands are on their back.- The teacher puts the first item into the first child's hands. The child cannot see the item but only touch it.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The first child gives the item to the next child and so on. - The child has to feel and touch to recognize if it's his own. - If it is correct the child has to make a step forward and look if he's right.
<u>Variations</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The children can use all the kind of item but with small differences to make it more difficult.
<u>Aims</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - They learn to identify elements from the environment by touching them. - The children have to use their visual memory. - They develop new vocabulary to express what they feel (long, short, hard, soft, rough)
<u>Comments</u>	When the children are memorizing their objects, the teacher goes to each child and helps him with questions to get clues to remember his object.
